Students will: ~Learn the basic grammatical rules of the Italian language, including regular and irregular verbs in the present and past tenses, agreement between nouns and adjectives, the use of simple or articulated prepositions ~Communicate simple thoughts in Italian by using basic vocabulary, such as gettings personal information, talking about the family, the weather, indicating preferences, likes and dislikes, needs and obligations. ~Write a simple paragraph in Italian of at least 100 words that includes the above goals. ~Read level-appropriate texts in Italian. ~Acquire a broad awareness of the cultures, values and customs of Italy and appreciate its rich cultural diversity.

ITAL_101-DL	Elementary Italian I	Revise Course
Expected Outcomes for Student:		
Upon completion of this course, the student should begin to acquire a solid foundation in Italian pronunciation, and spelling. He/she should be able to respond to simple questions dealing with the vocabulary and idioms that are being studied. The student should be able to write simple sentences using the vocabulary in questions to talk about him/herself, about his/her family, surroundings, activities. The tenses to be used at this level are the present tense and the present perfect tense (passato prossimo).

Acquire a broad awareness of the culture, values and customs of the Italian world and be able to discuss them.
