JPNS 102 | Elementary Japanese II | Revise Course

#### **Expected Outcomes for Student:**

Upon completion of this course, students will

- 1) be able to read and comprehend Japanese short stories with historical and social contexts
- 2) be able to write short essays to compare and contrast Japanese and American culture using Hiragana and Katakana characters along with approximately 100 Kanji characters
- 3) will be able to communicate using simple conversation with native speakers in both casual and formal speech levels.

JPNS 108 Japanese Conversation Through the Movies Revise Course

#### **Expected Outcomes for Student:**

Upon completion of this course, students will able to understand and analyze Japanese historical movies, and animation movies. Students will be able to obtain a brief knowledge of Japanese history, culture, the way of thinking, and society through movies. - 3) understand Japanese geographical, cultural, and historical background through literature.

JPNS\_225 Advanced Japanese 1 New Course

l. use the Japanese language properly in writing and speaking depending on whom they are talking/writing to -- either people who are superior(socially or older than the students) or equal or inferior(socially or the same age or younger) to the students.
